Commissions of inquiry

In 2022, Douglas was appointed as Counsel Assisting in the Royal Commission into the Robodebt Scheme. He appeared regularly in hearings of the Commission (led and unled) and was heavily involved in drafting the Commission's final report; published in July 2023.

Administrative and public law

Douglas has an extensive experience in administrative and public law. Native title

He has acted for both applicants and the State of Queensland in native title determination claims; appearing in both substantive and interlocutory proceedings before the Federal Court. Additionally, he has provided complex advice to both government agencies and native title applicants concerning the conduct of native title claims.

Proceedings that Douglas has acted in include, but are not limited to, the Githabul People (Waringh Waringh) determination application (QUD87/2021), the Wulli Wulli People #3 determination application (QUD6006/2000), and the Kabi Kabi First Nation Traditional Owners Native Title Claim Group determination application (QUD20/2019).

Additionally, Douglas has expertise in the compensation regime established under Division 5, Part 2 of the *Native Title Act 1993* (Cth) and has acted on behalf of native title holding groups in compensation claims. He has also advised on matters concerning harm to cultural heritage.
